

Cité Mémoire Charlevoix

- Starting at the end of June, this Cité Mémoire, the first outside Montréal, will be deployed across four corners of Charlevoix.
- A multimedia, artistic, playful and poetic experience through an enchanting setting, inspired by the history of Charlevoix, whose paintings introduce you to various characters portrayed by wellknown actors and local personalities.
- Deployed over more than 2,000 km² with 60 points of interest, 6 augmented realities, 4 projections, 1 podcast and 1 free mobile app.
- Projected along the river in the Pointe-au-Pic sector, the paintings will emerge from various surfaces such as the walls, the cliff and the ground.

Le Vol de l'Oiseau Mécanique

- A major new attraction at Le Massif de Charlevoix, which is scheduled to open at the end of June 2023, this world's first nightly mountainside carousel takes passengers flying over the mountain on chairlifts under the starry sky.

The first hydrogen-powered eco train

- A North American first in Charlevoix.
- During the summer of 2023, as part of a pilot project, the first eco passenger train powered by hydrogen in North America, the Coradia iLint from Alstom, will connect Charlevoix and Québec City.
- This convoy will become the 4th in the Train de Charlevoix fleet for the summer.
- Visitors can reserve seats beforehand.
- This is a partnership between the Government of Québec, Alstom, Groupe Harnois and Groupe Le Massif.




Mont-du-lac-des-Cygnes via ferrata adventure course


Village Viking Hóp


- Opening scheduled for April 14, 2023, in the quiet area of Saint-Placide Nord, in Baie-Saint-Paul.








Auberge des Balcons




Musée Maritime de Charlevoix



- The museum route has been redesigned and will begin with a new reception area and shop.
- The museum has received financial assistance totaling more than \$6
 million for work to shelter the schooners Jean-Yvan, Saint-André and
 Marie Clarisse, which will be done this year, aimed at conserving the
 buildings.



Riopelle in the spotlight


- To commemorate the 100th anniversary of Jean Paul Riopelle's birth, the Musée d'art contemporain de Baie-Saint-Paul and the Musée de Charlevoix in La Malbaie will celebrate the legacy of one of the 20th century's most influential artists.
- From June 17 to November 5 at the MACBSP, the *Un lieu de mémoire :*Contextes d'existence (A place of memory: Contexts of existence)
 exhibition will feature several Riopelle works that address travel as the main method of linking contexts and weaving memories.
- From June 16, 2023, to March 31, 2024 at the Musée de Charlevoix, Riopelle et l'art populaire (Riopelle and popular art), a major exhibition imagined by his daughter Yseult Riopelle, will pay tribute to Jean Paul Riopelle's fascination with popular art. Hunting, fishing and nature inspired him to create works from objects he found or stole, and whose meanings he redirected.




Papeterie Saint-Gilles




