






125 years for Fairmont Le Manoir Richelieu

Katabatik - Aventure dans Charlevoix is revealing three new highlights for this summer season:



New mountain biking trails in Petite-Rivière-Saint-François


- The Corporation du Sentier des Caps de Charlevoix and Le Massif de Charlevoix have been working on adapting several cross-country skiing trails for mountain biking this summer.
- The goal of this project is to provide cyclists with a network of trails with few or no technical challenges. A mountain bike will be required, since the riding trails will remain natural.
- By July 2024, if all goes according to schedule, the "La Boréale" cross-country ski trail will be
 open to bicycles. An old logging road about 1.5 km long will also provide access to Lac Tourville
 lake from this trail. A pergola will be built to provide visitors with a place to relax and enjoy the
 view.
- La Boréale is an 8.3 km loop that leads to the Liguori refuge and the La-Grande-Vue refuge. It can be reached via the Sentier des Caps de Charlevoix Visitor Centre and will soon be accessible from Le Massif de Charlevoix facilities.




Camp Le Manoir – New aerial activities


- Celebrating its 60th anniversary this year, the ever-festive Camp Le Manoir des Éboulements is adding a new aerial obstacle course this summer, featuring 14 tree-to-tree games and a double zip line overlooking the river.








Flavour Trail – New management





Christian Larochelle, ceramicist









Suites Nature Charlevoix – A new ecotourism project in Les Éboulements











ÖBois Charlevoix – New campground
